The 10th annual Muddy Duck Dash occurs April 23, 2022 at the University of North Georgia (Gainesville/Oakwood campus). Registration is OPEN!

The Dash is a family-friendly, fun, easy to moderate 3.1 mile obstacle style race that includes trail running and an incredible 25 obstacles including a 125 foot bubble water slide, shallow pond crossing, creek runs, mud pit, and more!

The Dash also offers the 1k Duckling Dash for the little duckies (primarily those 8 and under) or anyone who's abilities do not fit our full Dash course. Complete the course while tackling all obstacles or skipping the ones you choose in a supportive and encouraging environment.




EMPLOYER GIFT MATCHING
